1. GRANTEE: iDrink Products Inc.
Ann Arbor, MI
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
 - a. This special permit authorizes the transportation in commerce of certain used DOT Specification 3AL cylinders and containers that contain carbon dioxide, but not necessarily in an amount qualifying as hazardous material. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein. The most recent revision supersedes all previous revisions.
 - b. The safety analyses performed in the development of this special permit only considered the hazards and risks associated with the transportation in commerce.
 - c. No party status will be granted to this special permit.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 171.2(k) in that no person may, by marking or otherwise, represent that a hazardous material is present in a package, container, or motor vehicle if the hazardous material is not present, § 172.202(a)(5)(iii)(B) in that the number of cylinders must be identified on the shipping papers, and Subpart H of Part 172 that prescribes training for hazmat employees, except as provided herein.

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5. BASIS: This special permit is based on the application of iDrink Products Inc. dated June 7, 2015 submitted in accordance with § 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon.
6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

*This proper shipping name may be used until December 31, 2020.

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:
- a. PACKAGING - Prescribed packagings are:
- (1) DOT Specification 3AL cylinders packed within a fiberboard box; or
 - (2) Containers conforming to § 173.306(a)(1) packed within a fiberboard box.
- b. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS - iDrink Products Inc. is responsible as the offeror for all shipments made under this special permit. The carrier will verify package compliance at the collection point on behalf of iDrink Products Inc. prior to accepting the shipment.
- c. MARKING - The outer packaging provided by iDrink Products Inc. must be marked "DOT-SP 16504".
- d. Used cylinders or containers containing oxygen that exerts a gauge pressure less than 200 kPa (29.0 psig/43.8 psia) at 20 °C (68 °F) may be shipped as hazardous material, i.e., carbon dioxide, Division 2.2.
- e. In place of the training requirements specified in subpart H of Part 172, persons offering the cylinders or containers for transportation must comply with the closure instructions accompanying the fiberboard box.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

a. Under the terms of this special permit, the grantee is not authorized as a carrier.

b. A person who is not a holder of this special permit who receives a package covered by this special permit may reoffer it for transportation provided no modification or change is made to the package and it is reoffered for transportation in conformance with this special permit and the HMR.

c. A current copy of this special permit must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.

d. The instructions for properly preparing the cylinders or containers and closing the fiberboard box must be printed on or permanently affixed to the outside of the box.

e. Containers (see paragraph 7.a.(2)) filled with a material meeting the definition of a "Consumer Commodity" in § 171.8 may be re-classed as ORM-D and shipped as "Consumer Commodity" in accordance with § 173.306(i).

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle and rail freight.

10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this special permit must be carried aboard each motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this special permit.

11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this special permit and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:

o All terms and conditions prescribed in this special permit and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.

o Persons operating under the terms of this special permit must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.

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- o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this special permit must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this special permit in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this special permit, including display of its number, when this special permit has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

Under Title VII of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU)—"The Hazardous Materials Safety and Security Reauthorization Act of 2005" (Pub. L. 109-59), 119 Stat. 1144 (August 10, 2005), amended the Federal hazardous materials transportation law by changing the term "exemption" to "special permit" and authorizes a special permit to be granted up to two years for new special permits and up to four years for renewals.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: Shipments or operations conducted under this special permit are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 Immediate notice of certain hazardous materials incidents, and 171.16 Detailed hazardous materials incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this special permit must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety, in writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this special permit.
