

1. Atlantic Steamers Supply Co., Inc., Hoboken, New Jersey, is hereby granted an exemption from certain provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations to offer packages prescribed herein of a line throwing rocket for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes the transportation of line throwing rockets (originally classed as Class B explosives) as Class C explosives in limited quantities and in specified packagings, and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.
2. BASIS. This exemption is based on an application from Atlantic Steamers Supply Co., Inc., dated December 20, 1988, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.103 and the public proceeding thereon.
3. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class). Line throwing rockets 250m; classed as class C explosive.
4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Fireworks, common.
5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 173.92 and 173.100(r).
6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Motor vehicle, rail freight, cargo vessel, and cargo-aircraft only.
7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES. Packaging prescribed is a steel ammunition box, measuring 11" X 7" X 5-5/8" containing not more than two line throwing rockets cushioned with plastic bubble pack.
8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.
 - a. Persons who receive packages covered by this exemption may reship them pursuant to the provisions of 49 CFR 173.22a.
 - b. A copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each motor vehicle, vessel, and aircraft used to transport packages covered by this exemption.
 - c. Drivers must have been instructed as to necessary safeguards and proper procedure in the event of unusual delay, fire or accident.

9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving initiation or loss of package contents must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Transportation as soon as practicable.

10. EXPIRATION DATE. March 31, 1991.
