1. Vulcan Chemicals, Birmingham, Alabama, is hereby granted an emergency exemption from certain provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations to offer a package prescribed herein of a nonflammable gas residue for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes the transportation of a DOT Specification 105A500W tank car tank with defective vapor valves for the transportation of chlorine residue, and provides no relief from any regulations other than as specifically stated.

2. BASIS. This emergency exemption is based on Vulcan Chemicals' application of August 17, 1990, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.113, and a determination that it is necessary for protection of life and property.

3. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class). Chlorine, classed as a nonflammable gas.

4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Chlorine

5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 173.29(c)(2) and 179.100-13.

6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Rail freight

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES.

a. Packaging prescribed is a DOT Specification 105A500W tank car tank, UTLX 28191, with a defective vapor valves, which have been equipped with two Chlorine "C" kits to prevent the emission of chlorine vapors.

b. The manway protective housing cover while opened must be chained or otherwise fastened so that it cannot change position during transportation.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

a. Shipment must be between Groos, Michigan and Port Edwards, Wisconsin, a distance of 236 miles, using the most direct route available via the Wisconsin Central.

b. The tank car must be marked DOT-E 10446 above the DOT specification number in at least four inch letters on a contrasting background.

c. The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) is to be notified if any unusual incident occurs during the movement by contacting the:

d. Persons who receive packages covered by this exemption may reship them pursuant to the provisions of 49 CFR 173.22a.

9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Transportation (OHMT) as soon as practicable.

10. EXPIRATION DATE. October 31, 1990.
