1. GRANTEE: Defense Technology and Procurement Agency,  
Berne, Switzerland  
(U.S. Agent: Embassy of Switzerland,  
Washington, D.C.)
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION: This exemption authorizes the  
transportation in commerce certain explosive materials,  
which are forbidden or exceed the quantity limitations  
authorized for shipment by cargo aircraft only. This  
exemption provides no relief from any regulation other than  
as specifically stated.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-  
180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 172.101 table,  
column (9B); § 175.30.
5. BASIS. This exemption is based on the Defense Technology  
and Procurement Agency application dated January 2, 1999 and  
supplemental letter dated April 16, 1999 submitted in  
accordance with § 107.109 and supplement letter dated  
September 22, 1999.

and other explosives which are specifically identified to and acknowledged in writing by the Office of Hazardous Materials Exemptions & Approvals (OHMEA) prior to shipment. All explosives must have been approved pursuant to § 173.56.

For the N.O.S. entries above, the requirements of § 172.203(k) must be met.

7. PACKAGING & SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

- a. PACKAGING - DOT Specification 4A1 steel containers not to exceed 28 rockets per shipment.
- b. MARKING - Each container must be marked "DOT-E 10860".
- c. The carrier must conform to the requirements of § 175.320(b).

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

- a. Prior to each shipment, the name of the air carrier, types of explosives to be transported including the proper shipping name, classification and EX approval number and the destination point within the United States must be identified to and acknowledged in writing by OHMEA.
- b. Packaging, marking, and labeling are as prescribed in the ICAO Technical Instructions.

c. A copy of the air bill must be forwarded to the OHMEA within 10 days after completion of each shipment made under this exemption.

d. This exemption does not grant authority to use foreign controlled airspace or airports outside the United States.

9. MODE OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Cargo aircraft only.
10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each aircraft used to transport packages covered by this exemption. The shipper must furnish a copy of this exemption to the air carrier before or at the time the shipment is tendered.
11. COMPLIANCE. Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:
- All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, Parts 171-180.
  - Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when this exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

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12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. The carrier is required to report any incident involving fire, explosion, loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder of this exemption must inform AAHMS, in writing, of any incidents involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
