1. GRANTEE: Olin Corporation, Stamford, Connecticut
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION: This emergency exemption authorizes the transportation in commerce of a DOT Specification 105A500W tank car, containing a Division 2.3 material, meeting all DOT requirements except that the tank car has a defective safety relief valve which is equipped with a chlorine "C" kit. This exemption provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR 173.31(b)(3); 173.29(a); 179.100-12(c); and 179.100-13.
5. BASIS. This emergency exemption is based on Olin Corporation's application of November 14, 1995, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.113, and a determination that it is necessary for the protection of life and property.
6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR 172.101):

7. PACKAGING(S) and SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:
 - a. PACKAGING - Packaging prescribed is a DOT Specification 105A500W tank car, GATX 36728, with a defective safety relief valve. The tank car has been equipped with a chlorine "C" kit to prevent the emission of chlorine vapors.
 - b. The manway protective housing cover, if remaining on the tank car, must be chained or otherwise fastened in the open position so that it cannot change position during transportation.

c. MARKING - Tank car GATX 36728 must be marked "DOT-E 11590" in four inch letters and numerals on a contrasting background above the DOT specification number.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

a. Shipment of tank car GATX 36728 is authorized from Korah, VA to Milford, VA, a distance of approximately 40 miles utilizing the most direct route via CSXT .

b. Persons who receive packages covered by this exemption may reoffer them for transportation provided no modifications or changes are made to the packages, all terms of this exemption are complied with, and a current copy of this exemption is maintained at each facility from which such reoffering occurs.

c. The Federal Railroad Administration is to be notified if any unusual incident occurs, such as a derailment or exterior tank car damage, during the movement by contacting the:

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Rail freight.

10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: None as a requirement of this exemption.

11. COMPLIANCE. Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act:


- All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 Parts 171-180.
- Registration required by 49 CFR 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when the exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect unless a regulation has been amended making the exemption no longer necessary.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.

a. The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety as soon as practicable. (49 CFR 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incidents involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
