1. GRANTEE: DPC Industries
Houston, TX
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
 - a. This emergency exemption authorizes the one-time transportation in commerce of a non-specification, multi-unit tank car tank containing Chlorine. One of the tank car tank's valves cannot be closed because the valve threads are stripped. The valve is equipped with a Chlorine Institute Emergency "B" kit to prevent leakage during transportation. This exemption provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.
 - b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR §§ 173.24(b), 179.300-12(b), 179.300-13(a) and 179.300-14.
5. BASIS: This emergency exemption is based on the application of DPC Industries, Inc., dated June 8, 2000 and supplemental information, dated June 13, 2000 submitted in accordance with § 107.117 and a determination that it is necessary in order to protect life and property.

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6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

a. PACKAGING - Packaging prescribed is a non-DOT specification multi-unit tank car tank which is currently authorized under DOT-E 5951 for the transportation of chlorine. One of the tank car tank's valves cannot be closed because the valve threads are stripped. The valve is equipped with a Chlorine Institute Emergency "B" kit. The emergency kit must prevent leakage during transportation.

b. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS -

(1) The tank car tank will be transported from Texas Eastman in Longview, Texas, to DPC Industries, Inc., in Cleburne, Texas.

(2) The tank car tank will be transported by a DPC Industries vehicle and must be accompanied by personnel trained in how to proceed in the event of an emergency.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS: A current copy of this exemption must be maintained at the facility where the package is offered for transportation.

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle.

10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this exemption must be carried aboard the motor vehicle used to transport the package covered by this exemption.

11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:

- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.

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- o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

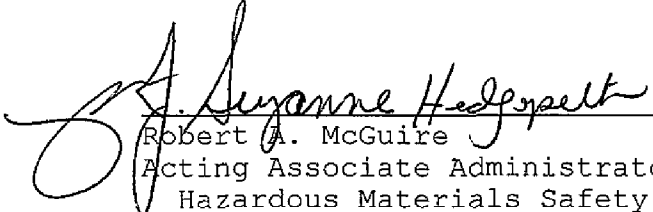
Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when this exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incident involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
