1. <u>GRANTEE</u>: Brenntag Mid-South, Inc. Henderson, KY

# 2. <u>PURPOSE AND LIMITATION</u>:

a. This special permit authorizes the transportation in commerce of nitric acid in drums that do not meet the minimum thickness requirements. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein. The most recent revision supersedes all previous revisions.

b. The safety analyses performed in development of this special permit only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.

- c. Party status will not be granted to this special permit.
- 3. <u>REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED</u>: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
- 4. <u>REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED</u>: 49 CFR § 173.158(b)(1)(i) in that a drum containing a hazardous material that is below the minimum wall thickness is not authorized, except as specified herein; and § 172.203(a) in that the special permit need not be notated on the shipping paper.
- 5. <u>BASIS</u>: This special permit is based on the application of Brenntag Mid-South, Inc. dated May 17, 2022 and submitted in accordance with § 107.109.

### 6. <u>HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101)</u>:

### 7. <u>SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES</u>:

a. <u>PACKAGING</u>: Prescribed packagings are UN1A1 drums with capacities between 115 to 210 liters marked and meeting the packing group I or II performance level. The drums must have a minimum thickness of not less than 1.35 mm. New construction is not authorized after May 1, 2001 for the drums described in this special permit.

b. <u>OPERATIONAL CONTROLS</u>: The drums under the special permit must remain in dedicated nitric acid service.

#### 8. <u>SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>:

a. A person who is not a holder of this special permit who receives a package covered by this special permit may reoffer it for transportation provided no modification or change is made to the package or its contents and it is reoffered for transportation in conformance with this special permit and the HMR.

b. A current copy of this special permit must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.

c. Notating the special permit number on the shipping paper as specified in § 172.203(a) is waived.

#### 9. <u>MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED</u>: Motor vehicle.

- 10. <u>MODAL REQUIREMENTS</u>: A current copy of this special permit must be carried aboard each motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this special permit.
- 11. <u>COMPLIANCE</u>: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this special permit and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 <u>et seq</u>:

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- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this special permit and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
- o Persons operating under the terms of this special permit must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
- o Registration required by § 107.601 <u>et seq</u>., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this special permit must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this special permit in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this special permit, including display of its number, when this special permit has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

Under Title VII of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU)- 'The Hazardous Materials Safety and Security Reauthorization Act of 2005' (Pub. L. 109-59), 119 Stat. 1144 (August 10, 2005), amended the Federal hazardous materials transportation law by changing the term "exemption" to "special permit" and authorizes a special permit to be granted up to two years for new special permits and up to four years for renewals.

12. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS</u>: Shipments or operations conducted under this special permit are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 - Immediate notice of certain hazardous materials incidents, and 171.16 - Detailed hazardous materials incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this special permit must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety, in writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this special permit.
