1. GRANTEE: Dow AgroSciences L.L.C.  
Indianapolis, Indiana
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
  - a. This exemption authorizes the transportation in commerce of sulfuryl fluoride in certain DOT specification cylinders that are not equipped with a pressure relief device. This exemption provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.
  - b. The safety analyses performed in development of this exemption only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce. The safety analyses did not consider the hazards and risks associated with use as a component of a transport vehicle or other device, or other uses not associated with transportation in commerce.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 173.301(f)(1) in that the DOT specification cylinders are not equipped with a pressure relief device as prescribed therein.
5. BASIS: This exemption is based on the application of Dow AgroSciences L.L.C., dated October 20, 2003 and additional information dated June 17, 2004 submitted in accordance with § 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon.

6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR § 172.101):

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

a. PACKAGING - Packagings prescribed are authorized DOT specification cylinders for Sulfuryl fluoride that meet all requirements of the applicable specification and the filling requirements except that they are not equipped with pressure relief devices as prescribed in § 173.301(f) (1).

b. TESTING - Each cylinder must be requalified for use every five years in accordance with § 180.209.

c. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS -

(1) The driver of the transport vehicle must be instructed that when the vehicle is in an accident involving spilled fuel or fire, the vehicle must be move to a safe location unless moving the vehicle would directly endanger others.

(2) Emergency response information provided with the shipment and available via an emergency response telephone number must indicate that the receptacles are not fitted with pressure relief devices and provide appropriate guidance in the event of a fire.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

a. A person who is not a holder of this exemption who receives a package covered by this exemption may reoffer it for transportation provided no modification or change is made to the package or its contents and it is reoffered for transportation in conformance with this exemption and the HMR.

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- b. A current copy of this exemption must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.
  - c. Each cylinder must be marked "DOT-E 13319" in addition to the specification markings.
  - d. Compliance with the hazard communication requirements of §§ 172.203(a) and 172.301(c) is required.
9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle, rail freight and cargo vessel.
10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS:
- a. A current copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each cargo vessel, aircraft or motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this exemption. The shipper must furnish a copy of this exemption to the air carrier before or at the time the shipment is tendered.
  - b. For transport by cargo vessel, cylinders must be secured within a freight container or ISO frame.
11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:
- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
  - o Persons operating under the terms of this exemption must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
  - o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this exemption must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this exemption in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when this exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

- 12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (Sections 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must inform the AAHMS, in writing, of any incident involving the package and shipments made under the terms of this exemption.
