# 2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:

- a. This special permit authorizes the repair of certain DOT 4L cylinders without requiring pressure testing. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein. The most recent revision supersedes all previous revisions.
- b. The safety analyses performed in the development of this special permit only considered the hazards and risks associated with the transportation in commerce.
- c. No party status will be granted to this special permit.
- 3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
- 4. <u>REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED</u>: 49 CFR §§ 172.203(a) and 172.301(c) in that marking the special permit number is waived; § 180.211(c)(2)(i) in that cylinders repaired as specified herein do not have to be pressure tested in accordance with the specifications under which they were originally manufactured.
- 5. <u>BASIS</u>: This special permit is based on the application of Contrivance Incorporated dated May 28, 2021, submitted in accordance with § 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon.

### 7. <u>SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES</u>:

a. <u>PACKAGING</u>: Prescribed packaging is a DOT specification 4L cylinder manufactured in accordance with the requirements of § 178.57.

### b. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS:

- (1) The repairs are limited to the external insulating jacket and components attached to it. These repairs do not affect the performance or integrity of the pressure retaining inner liner of the cylinder.
- (2) The repair of these DOT 4L cylinders must be in accordance with § 180.211 except as following:
  - (i) The pressure testing of the inner containment vessel (cylinder) is not required after repairing the external insulating jacket, the cylinder insulation and vacuum, the handling and foot rings, and external piping and components of the cylinder.
  - (ii) If the repair of the external jacket results in loss of vacuum, the value of the new vacuum must be recorded.

- (iii) The repairs must be carried out in accordance with Contrivance Incorporated's welding procedures on file with the Office of Hazardous Materials Safety.
- (iv) Repairs performed in accordance with this special permit must be by a person holding a requalifier identification number (RIN) as specified in § 107.805.
- (v) Upon completion of the repair, the cylinder must be marked in accordance with the provisions of § 180.213.

### 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

- a. A person who is not a holder of this special permit who receives a package covered by this special permit may reoffer it for transportation provided no modification or change is made to the package and it is reoffered for transportation in conformance with this special permit and the HMR.
- b. A current copy of this special permit must be maintained at each facility where the package is being repaired.
- c. The shipping paper and marking requirements of §§ 172.203(a) and 172.301(c) are waived.
- 9. <u>MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED</u>: Modes of transportation authorized in accordance with the Hazardous Materials Table in the HMR.
- 10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: None, other than as required by the HMR.
- 11. <u>COMPLIANCE</u>: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this special permit and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 <u>et seq</u>:
  - o All terms and conditions prescribed in this special permit and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
  - o Persons operating under the terms of this special permit must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
  - o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this special permit must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this special permit in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this special permit, including display of its number, when this special permit has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

Under Title VII of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) — "The Hazardous Materials Safety and Security Reauthorization Act of 2005" (Pub. L. 109-59), 119 Stat. 1144 (August 10, 2005), amended the Federal hazardous materials transportation law by changing the term "exemption" to "special permit" and authorizes a special permit to be granted up to two years for new special permits and up to four years for renewals.

12. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS</u>: Shipments or operations conducted under this special permit are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 Immediate notice of certain hazardous materials incidents, and 171.16 Detailed hazardous materials incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this special permit must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety, in writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this special permit.
