1. <u>GRANTEE</u>: Department of Defense US Army Military Surface Deployment & Distribution Command Scott Air Force Base, IL

2. <u>PURPOSE AND LIMITATION</u>:

a. This special permit authorizes the transportation in commerce of UN2030, hydrazine aqueous solution in the packaging in paragraph 7.a. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR), the International Civil Aviation Organization's Technical Instructions for the Safe Transport of Dangerous Goods by Air (ICAO TI), or the International Maritime Dangerous Goods (IMDG) Code other than as specifically stated herein. The most recent revision supersedes all previous revisions.

b. The safety analyses performed in the development of this special permit only considered the hazards and risks associated with the transportation in commerce.

c. No party status will be granted to this special permit.

d. This special permit serves as an "exemption" as defined in 1;3.1.1 of the ICAO TI, as an "exemption" under Chapter 7.9, Section 7.9.1 of the IMDG Code (see IMO MSC/Circ. 1075-Granting Exemptions from the Provisions of the IMDG Code), and as a "Competent Authority Approval" as defined under 49 CFR § 107.1.

- 3. <u>REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED</u>: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180, the ICAO TI, and the IMDG Code.
- 4. <u>REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED</u>: 49 CFR § 173.27(f)(3), Table 2 in that the maximum net capacity of the inner packaging may not exceed 10 L, § 173.202 in that

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non-specification packaging is not authorized, Packing Instruction 855 of the ICAO TI in that the maximum inner packaging quantity per receptacle may not exceed 2.5 L and non-specification packaging is not authorized, and Packing Instruction P001 of the IMDG Code in that non-specification packaging is not authorized, except as specified herein.

5. <u>BASIS</u>: This special permit is based on the application of Department of Defense US Army Military Surface Deployment & Distribution Command dated January 26, 2024 submitted in accordance with § 107.109.

7. <u>SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES</u>:

a. <u>PACKAGING</u>: Packaging prescribed is a stainless-steel tank of 0.078 inch thickness, designed for 400 psig and having a capacity of 6.6 gallons. This tank must be placed in a non-specification, high-impact polyethylene container or a polyethylene tube and then placed in a non-specification polyethylene foam container. Test reports on each container are on file with the Office of Hazardous Materials Safety.

b. <u>OPERATIONAL CONTROLS</u>: None.

8. <u>SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>:

a. Under the terms of this special permit, the grantee may only offer hazardous materials (i.e., the grantee is not authorized as a carrier in commerce).

b. A person who is not a holder of this special permit who receives a package covered by this special permit may reoffer it for transportation provided no modification or change is made to the package and it is reoffered for transportation in conformance with this special permit, the HMR, the ICAO TI, and the IMDG Code.

c. A current copy of this special permit must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.

d. This special permit in no way affects the need to obtain any required authorizations from other agencies of the United States Government or from the competent authorities of the States of origin, transit, over flight, and destination of the consignment, as well as the State of the air operator.

- 9. <u>MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED</u>: Motor vehicle, rail freight, cargo vessel, and cargo-only aircraft.
- 10. <u>MODAL REQUIREMENTS</u>: A current copy of this special permit must be carried aboard each cargo vessel, aircraft, or motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this special permit. The shipper must furnish a copy of this special permit to the air carrier before or at the time the shipment is tendered.
- 11. <u>COMPLIANCE</u>: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this special permit and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 <u>et seq</u>:
 - o All terms and conditions prescribed in this special permit and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
 - o Persons operating under the terms of this special permit must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
 - o Registration required by § 107.601 <u>et seq</u>., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this special permit must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this special permit in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this special permit, including display of its number, when this special permit has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

Under Title VII of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) — "The Hazardous Materials Safety and Security Reauthorization Act of 2005" (Pub. L. 109-59), 119 Stat. 1144 (August 10, 2005), amended the Federal hazardous materials transportation law by changing the term "exemption" to "special permit" and authorizes a special permit to be granted up to two years for new special permits and up to four years for renewals.

12. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS</u>: Shipments or operations conducted under this special permit are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 - Immediate notice of certain hazardous materials incidents, and 171.16 - Detailed hazardous materials incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this special permit must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety, in

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writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this special permit.
