#### 2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:

- a. This special permit authorizes the transportation in commerce of lithium ion batteries exceeding 35 kg via cargo-only aircraft. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) or the International Civil Aviation Organization's Technical Instructions for the Safe Transport of Dangerous Goods by Air (ICAO TI) other than as specifically stated herein. The most recent revision supersedes all previous revisions.
- b. The safety analyses performed in the development of this special permit only considered the hazards and risks associated with the transportation in commerce.
- c. No party status will be granted to this special permit.
- d. This special permit serves as an approval under Special Provision A99 of the ICAO TI and as a "Competent Authority Approval" as defined under 49 CFR § 107.1.
- 3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
- 4. <u>REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED</u>: 49 CFR § 172.101 Hazardous Materials Table Column (9B) in that lithium batteries may have a mass exceeding 35 kg per package; and 173.185(b)(6) in that large packagings may be used for transportation by aircraft, as specified herein.

5. <u>BASIS</u>: This special permit is based on the application of Maserati spa dated January 24, 2024, submitted in accordance with § 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon.

# 7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

### a. <u>OPERATIONAL CONTROLS</u>:

- (1) Batteries authorized for transportation under the terms of this special permit are identified as follows:
  - (i) M182 (consists of 33 modules in a 3s2p configuration comprised of cells identified as CE6F0) with a nominal energy ratting of 104.9 kWh.
  - (ii) M189 (consists of 32 modules in a 2p6s configuration comprised of cells identified as E66A) with a nominal energy ratting of 90.5 kWh.
- (2) The state of charge for lithium ion batteries must be not more than 30% when offered for aircraft transportation.
- (3) Cells and batteries must be protected against short-circuiting.
- (4) A battery must be equipped with a battery management system that has been verified as preventing overcharge, short circuits, and over discharge between modules in accordance with The UN Manual of Tests and Criteria 38.3.3(g).
- (5) Each battery containing cells or series of cells connected in parallel must be equipped with an effective means of preventing dangerous reverse current flow.

- (6) Lithium ion cells or batteries that are leaking or liable to rapidly disassemble, dangerously react produce a flame or a dangerous evolution of heat or a dangerous emission of toxic, corrosive, or flammable gases, or vapors under normal conditions of transport may not be transported under this special permit.
- (7) Only employees with the current training adhering to § 172.704 are authorized to package, mark, label, and prepare the required documentation.

#### b. TESTING REQUIREMENTS:

- (1) Each cell within the module must be of a type tested in accordance with the UN Manual of Tests and Criteria, 6<sup>th</sup> Revised Edition.
- (2) Each module must be of a type tested in accordance with the UN Manual of Tests and Criteria, 6<sup>th</sup> Revised Edition.
- (3) Any change in the cell or the module from the tested type invalidates this Special Permit.

#### c. PACKAGING REQUIREMENTS:

- (1) Each battery must be packaged in a UN 50D wooden Large Packaging
- (2) Packages offered for transportation must be in accordance with the requirements in Packing Instruction 974 of the Supplement to the ICAO TI. Additionally, waste lithium battery assemblies and lithium battery assemblies being shipped for recycling or disposal are forbidden from air transport, and lithium battery assemblies must not be packed in the same outer packaging with substances and articles of Class 1 (explosives) other than Division 1.4S, Division 2.1 (flammable gases), Class 3 (flammable liquids), Division 4.1 (flammable solids), or Division 5.1 (oxidizers).
- (3) Not more than one battery is allowed per package.
- (4) The net weight of battery model M182 must not exceed 657.8 kg.
- (5) The net weight of battery model M189 must not exceed 605 kg.
- (6) The package must display a CAO label.
- d. <u>MARKING</u>: Each package, and overpack if used, must be marked with the Special Permit number "DOT-SP 21711" in accordance with § 172.301(c).

## 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

- a. Under the terms of this special permit, the grantee may only offer hazardous materials (i.e., the grantee is not authorized as a carrier).
- b. A person who is not a holder of this special permit who receives a package covered by this special permit may reoffer it for transportation provided no modification or change is made to the package and it is reoffered for transportation in conformance with this special permit, the HMR, and the ICAO TI.
- c. A current copy of this special permit must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.
- d. This special permit in no way affects the need to obtain any required authorizations from other agencies of the United States Government or from the competent authorities of countries of origin, transit, destination, and the State of operator.
- e. The special permit holder must maintain a record of all activity conducted under the authority granted in this special permit and upon request, make this record available to DOT representatives or enforcement officials. The record must contain a listing and number of shipments made to include:
  - (1) Dates of shipment; and
  - (2) Description of each type of shipment.
- 9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Cargo-only aircraft.
- 10. <u>MODAL REQUIREMENTS</u>: A current copy of this special permit must be carried aboard each aircraft used to transport packages covered by this special permit. The shipper must furnish a copy of this special permit to the air carrier before or at the time the shipment is tendered.
- 11. <u>COMPLIANCE</u>: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this special permit and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:
  - o All terms and conditions prescribed in this special permit and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
  - o Persons operating under the terms of this special permit must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
  - o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this special permit must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this special permit in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this special permit, including display of its number, when this special permit has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

Under Title VII of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU)—"The Hazardous Materials Safety and Security Reauthorization Act of 2005" (Pub. L. 109-59), 119 Stat. 1144 (August 10, 2005), amended the Federal hazardous materials transportation law by changing the term "exemption" to "special permit" and authorizes a special permit to be granted up to two years for new special permits and up to four years for renewals.

12. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS</u>: Shipments or operations conducted under this special permit are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 - Immediate notice of certain hazardous materials incidents, and 171.16 - Detailed hazardous materials incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this special permit must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety, in writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this special permit.
