1. GRANTEE: U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region 9  
San Francisco, CA
2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATIONS:
  - a. This emergency special permit authorizes the transportation of expired, unsecured, and improperly stored hand sanitizer from two locations described herein. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein. The most recent revision supersedes all previous revisions.
  - b. The safety analyses performed in the development of this special permit only considered the hazards and risks associated with the transportation in commerce.
  - c. No party status will be granted to this special permit.
3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171- 180.
4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR § 173.150(b) in that packages exceed 30 kg (66 lbs).
5. BASIS: This emergency special permit is based on the application of U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region 9 dated August 11, 2025, submitted in accordance with § 107.117 and the determination it was necessary to prevent significant injury to persons or property.

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

- a. PACKAGING: Prescribed packagings are plastic bottles not exceeding 1 L (0.3 gallons) capacity or plastic pouches containing wipes with absorbed hazardous material. The inner packagings are contained in either non-specification strong outer packagings or in poly-lined UN 11G rigid fiberboard IBCs. Void spaces in IBCs shall be filled with vermiculite.
- b. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS:
  - (1) Transportation is authorized one-way from either Victorville, CA or Phelan, CA to an approved EPA recycling facility.
  - (2) Packagings shall be transported in steel shipping containers.
  - (3) Transportation must be conducted on highways and avoid residential areas as much as possible.
  - (4) Transportation must occur under the oversight of the Environmental Protection Agency.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

- a. A person who is not a holder of this special permit, but receives a packaging covered by this special permit, may reoffer it for transportation provided no modification or change is made to the packaging and it is offered for transportation in conformance with this special permit and the HMR.
- b. A current copy of this special permit must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle.

10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this special permit must be carried aboard each motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this special permit.
11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this special permit and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:
  - o All terms and conditions prescribed in this special permit and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
  - o Persons operating under the terms of this special permit must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
  - o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each "Hazmat employee", as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this special permit must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this special permit in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this special permit, including display of its number, when this special permit has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

Under Title VII of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) — "The Hazardous Materials Safety and Security Reauthorization Act of 2005" (Pub. L. 109-59), 119 Stat. 1144 (August 10, 2005), amended the Federal hazardous materials transportation law by changing the term "exemption" to "special permit" and authorizes a special permit to be granted up to two years for new special permits and up to four years for renewals.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: Shipments or operations conducted under this special permit are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 - Immediate notice of certain hazardous materials incidents, and 171.16 - Detailed hazardous materials incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this special permit must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety, in writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this special permit.
