1. **GRANTEE:** Syensqo USA LLC  
Lawrence, NJ
2. **PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:**
  - a. This special permit authorizes the one-time, one-way transportation of UN portable tanks that were filled with hazardous materials after the expiration of the most recent periodic qualification. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein. The most recent revision supersedes all previous revisions.
  - b. The safety analyses performed in the development of this special permit only considered the hazards and risks associated with the transportation in commerce.
  - c. No party status will be granted to this special permit.
3. **REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED:** 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
4. **REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED:** 49 CFR § 172.302(c) in that the tanks do not need to be marked with the special permit number; 173.32(a)(2), 177.801, and 180.605(a) in that the tanks were filled after the prescribed periodic test or inspections were due to be performed.
5. **BASIS:** This special permit is based on the application of Syensqo USA LLC dated December 9, 2025, submitted in accordance with § 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon.

6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR 172.101):

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

a. PACKAGING: Prescribed packagings are nine UN “T14” specification portable tanks that may have been filled with hazardous materials after the expiration of the most recent periodic qualification. The nine UN “T14” specification portable tank identification numbers are on file with the Office of Hazardous Materials Safety (OHMS).

b. TESTING: Each UN “T14” specification portable tank must have a pre-trip external visual inspection performed prior to being transported. If there are any indications of leaking hazardous materials, the portable tank is not authorized for transportation under this special permit.

c. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS:

(1) Each UN “T14” specification portable tank is authorized for a one-time, one-way movement from Charleston, SC to Goose Creek, SC by an authorized motor carrier as stated in the application dated December 9, 2025, and on file with the Office of Hazardous Materials Safety (OHMS).

(2) Each UN “T14” specification portable tank must be properly secured to prevent shifting under conditions normally incident to transportation.

(3) No other hazardous materials shall be transported with any UN “T14” specification portable tank.

(4) Only one UN “T14” specification portable tank may be transported per motor vehicle when offered for transportation.

d. MARKING:

(1) Each UN “T14” specification portable tank must be marked with the phrase “TANK MOVING FOR CLEANING” after the pre-trip inspection in paragraph 7(b) is completed.

(2) The UN “T14” specification portable tanks are not required to be marked with the special permit number as required by 49 CFR § 172.302(c).

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

a. A person who is not a holder of this special permit who receives a package covered by this special permit may reoffer it for transportation provided no modification or change is made to the package or its contents and it is reoffered for transportation in conformance with this special permit and the HMR.

b. A current copy of this special permit must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.

9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle.

10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: A current copy of this special permit must be carried aboard each motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this special permit.

11. COMPLIANCE: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this special permit and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 et seq:

- o All terms and conditions prescribed in this special permit and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
- o Persons operating under the terms of this special permit must comply with the security plan requirement in Subpart I of Part 172 of the HMR, when applicable.
- o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when applicable.

Each “Hazmat employee”, as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this special permit must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this special permit in addition to the training required by § 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this special permit, including display of its number, when this special permit has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

Under Title VII of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) — “The Hazardous Materials Safety and Security Reauthorization Act of 2005” (Pub. L. 109-59), 119 Stat. 1144 (August 10, 2005), amended the Federal hazardous materials transportation law by changing the term “exemption” to “special permit” and authorizes a special permit to be granted up to two years for new special permits and up to four years for renewals.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: Shipments or operations conducted under this special permit are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 - Immediate notice of certain hazardous materials incidents, and 171.16 - Detailed hazardous materials incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this special permit must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety, in writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this special permit.
