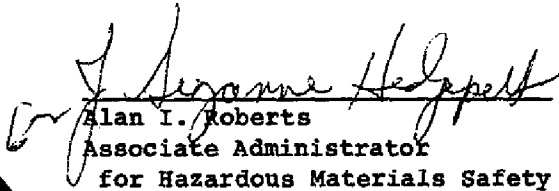

FOURTH REVISION June 6, 1985

In accordance with 49 CFR 107.105 of the Department of Transportation (DOT) Hazardous Materials Regulations DOT-E 7063 is hereby extended for the party(ies) listed below by changing the expiration date in paragraph 10 to September 30, 1994. This change is effective from the issue date of this extension. All other terms of the exemption remain unchanged.

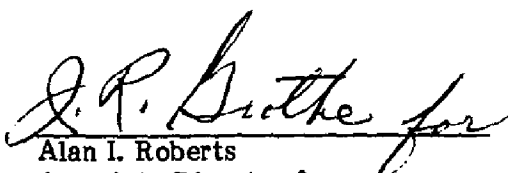
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DOT-E 7063
(FOURTH REVISION)

1. Twin Lake Chemical, Inc. (TLCI), Lockport, NY, is hereby granted an exemption from those provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations specified in paragraph 5 below to offer packages prescribed herein of a corrosive material for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes use of a removable-head polyethylene container and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.
2. BASIS. This exemption is based on TLCI's application dated March 12, 1985, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon.
3. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class). Phosphorous pentachloride, classed as corrosive material.
4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Phosphorous pentachloride, solid.
5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 173.191(a).
6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Motor vehicle, rail freight, and cargo vessel.
7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES. Packaging prescribed is a polyethylene container meeting all requirements of DOT Specification 35 (maximum gross weight 65 pounds).
8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.
 - a. Persons who receive packages covered by this exemption may reship them pursuant to the provisions of 49 CFR 173.22a.
 - b. A copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each vessel used to transport packages covered by this exemption.
9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving loss of contents of the package must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Regulation as soon as practicable.
10. EXPIRATION DATE. May 15, 1987.
