

In accordance with 49 CFR 107.105 of the Department of Transportation (DOT) Hazardous Materials Regulations DOT-E 7072 is hereby extended for the party(ies) listed below by changing the expiration date in paragraph 10 to September 30, 1994. This change is effective from the issue date of this extension. All other terms of the exemption remain unchanged.

1. Container Corporation of America, Plastics Division, Wilmington, Delaware, is hereby granted an exemption from certain provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations to manufacture, mark, and sell the packaging prescribed in paragraph 7 below for use in the transportation of certain corrosive liquids, and poison B liquids described in paragraph 3 below in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes the use of DOT Specification 34 polyethylene drums for certain materials identified in paragraph 3 below, and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.

2. BASIS. This exemption is based on Container Corporation of America's applications dated August 6, 1985 and April 17, 1989, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon, supplemented by letter dated August 6, 1986.

3. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class).

a. Thionyl chloride, Trimethylacetyl chloride (Pivaloyl chloride), Benzoyl chloride, and Benzyl chloride, classed as corrosive material.

b. Diethyl chlorophosphate; an insecticide, liquid (specifically Dyfonate 4-E-D), classed as poison B.

4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). The specific chemical name or generic description, as appropriate.

5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 173.247, 173.295, 173.346, 173.359.

6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Motor vehicle, rail freight and cargo vessel.

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES.

a. Packaging prescribed is a DOT Specification 34 polyethylene drum of up to 55-gallon marked (rated) capacity.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

a. Shippers may use the packaging covered by this exemption pursuant to 49 CFR 173.22a.

b. A copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each vessel used to transport packages covered by this exemption.

c. Drums marked "DOT-E 8301" manufactured prior to October 31, 1989 are authorized for use under the terms and conditions of this exemption.


d. A copy of this exemption, in its current status, must be maintained at each manufacturing facility at which this packaging is manufactured and must be made available to DOT representative upon request.

e. Each packaging manufactured in accordance with the requirements of this exemption must be marked in a manner which identifies the physical location (city and state) of the facility at which it is manufactured.

9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving loss of the package contents or packaging damage must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Transportation as soon as practicable.

10. EXPIRATION DATE. May 31, 1991.
