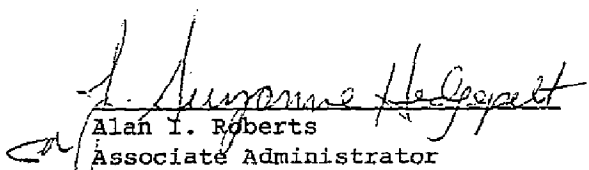

THIRD REVISION August 25, 1986

In accordance with 49 CFR 107.105 of the Department of Transportation (DOT) Hazardous Materials Regulations DOT-E 7097 is hereby extended for the party(ies) listed below by changing the expiration date in paragraph 10 to July 30, 1994. This change is effective from the issue date of this extension. All other terms of the exemption remain unchanged.

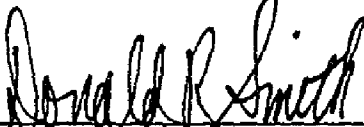

(THIRD REVISION)

1. Fuller System, Inc., Woburn, Massachusetts, is hereby granted an exemption from those provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations specified in paragraph 5 below to offer packages prescribed herein of certain Class B poisonous solids for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption excepts dry mixtures of parathion and tetraethyl dithio pyrophosphate from specification packaging requirements, and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.
2. BASIS. This exemption is based on Fuller System, Incorporated's application dated June 24, 1986, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon.
3. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class). Parathion mixture, dry, and tetraethyl dithio pyrophosphate mixture, dry containing not more than 25% by weight of the active ingredient; classed as Poison B.
4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Parathion mixture, dry or tetraethyl dithio pyrophosphate mixture, dry, as appropriate.
5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 173.377(f).
6. MODE OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Motor vehicle.
7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES. The dry mixtures qualify for the exception from specification packaging requirements subject to the following conditions:
 - a. The liquid must be fully absorbed in the inert material.
 - b. The maximum amount of the absorbed poisonous liquid must be limited to 2 ounces (either fluid or avoirdupois) per inside container.
 - c. The mixture must be in inside metal containers not exceeding 32 ounces capacity each packed in strong outside containers.
8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS. Persons who receive packages covered by this exemption may reshipe them pursuant to the provisions of 49 CFR 173.22a.
9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving loss of contents of the package must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Transportation as soon as practicable.

10. EXPIRATION DATE. July 31, 1988.
