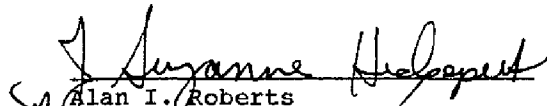

In accordance with 49 CFR 107.105 of the Department of Transportation (DOT) Hazardous Materials Regulations DOT-E 8175 is hereby extended for the party(ies) listed below by changing the expiration date in paragraph 10 to August 31, 1993. This change is effective from the issue date of this extension. All other terms of the exemption remain unchanged.

This extension applies only to party(ies) listed below based on the application(s) received in accordance with 49 CFR 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon. This extension constitutes a necessary part of this exemption and must be attached to it.

1. The Norac Company, Inc., Azusa, California, is hereby granted an exemption from those provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations specified in paragraph 5 below to offer packages prescribed herein of a certain organic peroxide for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes shipment of benzoyl peroxide, wet, in a plastic-lined DOT 21-C fiber drum, without inside polyethylene container, and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.
2. BASIS. This exemption is based on The Norac Company, Inc.'s application dated March 5, 1979, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.103 and the public proceeding thereon.
3. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class). Benzoyl peroxide, slurry, containing at least 30% water by weight, classed as organic peroxide.
4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Benzoyl peroxide.
5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 173.157(a)(4); 178.224.
6. MODE OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Motor vehicle.
7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES. Packaging prescribed is DOT Specification 21C-400 fiber drum, plastic-lined (in accordance with the specifications prescribed in petitioner's application dated March 5, 1979) instead of having inside container made of polyethylene film. Gross weight not to exceed 287 pounds (130 kilos) in one drum. Drum, prepared as for shipment, must be capable of satisfactorily withstanding the performance tests prescribed in 49 CFR 178.224-2.
8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS. Persons who receive packages covered by this exemption may reship them pursuant to the provisions of 49 CFR 173.22a.
9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving loss of contents of the package must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Regulation as soon as practicable.
10. EXPIRATION DATE. July 31, 1981.
