DOT-E 8717
(FIRST REVISION)

1. Goodloe E. Moore, Incorporated, Danville, Illinois, is hereby granted an exemption from those provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations specified in paragraph 5 below to offer packages prescribed herein of certain adhesives, classed as flammable liquids, for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes the re-use of DOT specification 17H steel drums of 55-gallon capacity, with an inside polyethylene liner of 0.010 inch minimum thickness, for shipment of certain adhesives classed as flammable liquids, and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.
2. BASIS. This exemption is based on Goodloe E. Moore, Incorporated's application dated January 7 and 30, 1986, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon.
3. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class). Adhesive, classed as flammable liquid.
4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Cement, liquid, n.o.s.
5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 173.28(m).
6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Motor vehicle.
7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES. Packaging prescribed is DOT Specification 17H drum of 55-gallon capacity, with an inside packaging of polyethylene film having a minimum thickness of 0.010 inches. (Polyethylene inside packaging may be closed by means of tie-top or disc which is fitted under the removable head of the drum, on top of the adhesive.) Drums may be re-used without reconditioning in accordance with the provisions of 49 CFR 173.28(m) and a new, clean inside polyethylene packaging must be used each time a drum is filled with adhesive, and the inside of the drum must be visually inspected for dents, deterioration or other defects, which would be cause for the drum to be removed from further reuse without reconditioning.
8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.
 - a. Persons who receive packages covered by this exemption may reship them pursuant to the provisions of 49 CFR 173.22a.
9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving loss of contents of the package must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Transportation as soon as practicable.
