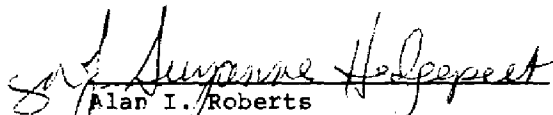

In accordance with 49 CFR 107.105 of the Department of Transportation (DOT) Hazardous Materials Regulations DOT-E 9643 is hereby extended for the party(ies) listed below by changing the expiration date in paragraph 10 to March 31, 1994. This change is effective from the issue date of this extension. All other terms of the exemption remain unchanged.

1. Eastman Kodak Company, Rochester, N.Y. is hereby granted an exemption from those provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations specified in paragraph 5 below to transport packages prescribed herein of various hazardous materials in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes the transportation of certain hazardous materials over 0.8 miles of public highway exempted from DOT requirements for package marking, labeling, specification packaging and segregation and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.

2. BASIS. This exemption is based on an application from Eastman Kodak Company dated June 19, 1986 and supplemental letter dated March 19, 1987, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.103 and the public proceeding thereon.

3. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class). Flammable liquids, Flammable liquids/Corrosive, Oxidizers, Flammable solids, Corrosive liquids, Corrosive solids, Corrosive liquid/poison, Poison B and Irritating materials classed as Flammable liquid, Oxidizer, Flammable solid, Corrosive material, Class B poison and Irritating material.

4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Specific chemical or generic name, as appropriate.

5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 172.300, 172.400, 177.848 and Part 178.

6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Motor vehicle.

7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES.

a. All packaging must comply with 49 CFR 173.24.

b. Shipping papers must be issued for all hazardous materials.

c. All vehicles must be placarded in compliance with 49 CFR 172.500.

d. All individual packages must be marked and labeled with Kodak's "in plant" hazard warning labels.

8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

a. Materials shipped under this exemption must be transported over 0.8 miles of Lee Road in Rochester, New York, during periods of low vehicular traffic.

- b. Each highway vehicle must be equipped with a radio communication system which can be used to contact emergency response personnel if necessary.
 - c. A copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each motor vehicle used to transport packages covered by this exemption.
 - d. Drivers must have been instructed as to necessary safeguards and proper procedure in the event of unusual delay, fire or accident.
9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving loss of contents of a package must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Transportation (OHMT) as soon as possible.
10. EXPIRATION DATE. September 30, 1988.
