
1. Degussa Corporation, Teterboro, New Jersey, is hereby granted an exemption from certain provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations to offer packages prescribed herein of a certain oxidizer solid for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes the shipment of Sodium Perborate, anhydrous, classed as an oxidizer, in DOT Specification 44B and 44C multiwall paper bags, or DOT Specification 44P all-plastic bags, and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.
2. BASIS. This exemption is based on Degussa Corporation's applications dated August 18, September 10, 1987, and April 25, 1988, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.103 and the public proceeding thereon.
3. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class). Sodium Perborate, anhydrous, (Oxoborate) classed as oxidizer.
4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). The specific chemical name or generic commodity description, as appropriate.
5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 173.154; 175.3
6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Motor vehicle, rail freight, cargo vessel, cargo-aircraft only.
7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES. Packagings prescribed are DOT Specification 44B or 44C multiwall paper bags, or DOT Specification 44P all-plastic bags.
8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.
 - a. Persons who receive packages covered by this exemption may reship them pursuant to the provisions of 49 CFR 173.22a.
 - b. A copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each vessel or aircraft used to transport packages covered by this exemption.
9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving loss of contents of the package must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Transportation as soon as practicable.
