Dear Mr. George:

The Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) has reviewed your letter of March 7, 2014, in which Tennessee Gas Pipeline, L.L.C. notified PHMSA that it completed the replacement of a portion of Line 230B-200, Niagara Spur Loop Line near Lockport, New York, on October 10, 2013, and no longer needs the special permit.

In order for PHMSA to officially close out the special permit as requested, please provide the following details of the replaced pipeline and location of the special permit segment:

- 1. pipeline stationing and mile posts;
- 2. maximum allowable operating pressure of the pipeline;
- 3. present class location;
- 4. pertinent properties of the replaced pipeline, including pipe diameter, wall thickness, grade, seam type, coating, and pipe mill test reports (pipe yield strength, ultimate tensile strength, and chemical composition);
- 5. in-place pressure test documents; and
- 6. a report confirming girth weld non-destructive tests.
