### Overview

The U.S. Department of Transportation's Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) has announced it is issuing Fiscal Year 2023 grants from its Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety programs. The grants will be awarded to states, local communities, Tribal entities, and non-profit organizations to support state pipeline and hazardous materials safety programs. Grantees will use awarded funds to train first responders; educate the public on local safety initiatives, including pipeline damage prevention; and develop community incident response plans.

PHMSA provides comprehensive grant programs that are designed to improve damage prevention, develop new technologies, improve both hazmat and pipeline safety. Additionally, both the pipeline safety and hazmat safety grant programs has helped to foster partnerships with local communities, and universities to promote pipeline awareness campaigns, provide resources for emergency preparedness, development of pipeline resources and information, and the implementation of best practices regarding pipeline and hazmat safety nationwide.

# Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) Grants

PHMSA is issuing HMEP Grants to the states, territories, and tribes to enhance their ability to respond to hazardous materials transportation incidents. The HMEP Grant Program provides federal financial and technical assistance to states, territories, and federally recognized tribes to increase their ability to handle hazardous materials transportation incidents safely and efficiently. HMEP grant funds assist states, territories, and tribes in performing their hazardous materials response duties and aid in the development, implementation, and improvement of emergency plans for local communities and training for emergency responders to help communities prepare for potential hazardous materials transportation incidents.

# Hazardous Materials Instructure Training (HMIT) Grants

The HMIT Grant Program was established by the Hazardous Materials Transportation Safety and Security Reauthorization Act of 2005 (P. L. 109-59) and reauthorized by the Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (Pub. L. 114-94), codified at 49 U.S.C. § 5107(e) to make grants for the purpose of training hazardous materials (hazmat) instructors and, to the extent determined to be appropriate, for such instructors to train hazmat employees. The HMIT Grant Program is open to non-profit organizations that demonstrate expertise in conducting a training program for hazmat employees and the ability to reach and involve, in a training program, a target population for hazmat employees.

### **Supplemental Public Sector Training (SPST) Grants**

The SPST Grant Program was established by Congress in the Hazardous Materials Transportation Authorization Act of 1994 (P.L. 103-311), which amended 49 U.S.C. § 5116. The SPST grant is designed to train hazmat instructors using the train-the-trainer model, and individuals responsible for responding to incidents involving hazardous materials. The SPST grants are awarded on a discretionary basis based on a statement of need to train hazmat instructors to conduct hazardous materials response training programs and train emergency responders affected by incidents involving hazardous materials. This is the first year PHMSA received more than one eligible application from fire service organizations.

## **Community Safety Grants (CSG)**

The CSG is designed to conduct national outreach and training programs to assist communities in preparing for and responding to incidents involving the transportation of hazardous materials, including Class 3 flammable liquids by rail. The CSG also helps train state and local personnel responsible for enforcing the safe transportation of hazardous materials, including Class 3 flammable liquids.

# Assistance for Local Emergency Response Training (ALERT) Grants

The ALERT grant is designed to train local emergency responders to recognize and respond to rail transportation flammable liquid emergencies. Incidents involving the transportation of flammable liquids by rail pose special risks to emergency responders and the public.

The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, P.L.116-260, authorizes PHMSA to use money recovered from prior year Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness grant awards to fund the ALERT Grant Program. The ALERT grants will be used by recipients to provide training for volunteer or remote emergency responders to respond to incidents that involve hazardous materials shipments by rail of crude oil, ethanol, and other flammable liquids.

# Hazardous Materials State Inspection (HMSI) Grants

The Hazardous Materials State Inspection (HMSI) Grant is a new financial assistance program (as of FY 2022) that provides grants to states for the performance of hazardous material shipper inspections that leverage available resources, improve the safety of hazardous materials transport, reduce fatalities, and reduce injuries. States can utilize HMSI funding to cover costs for hazardous materials shipper inspections to include personnel, travel, equipment, supplies, and training for hazmat inspectors.

Congress provided up to \$2.5 million for the HMSI financial assistance program in the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (Pub. L. 116-260). The HMSI Grant complements similar grant funding from the Federal Motor Carriers Safety Administration, Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program, which provides funding for inspections and compliance reviews of motor carriers (truck and bus companies) but does not extend to companies that ship hazardous materials, where most hazmat violations originate.
