## **Hazardous Materials Grants FY2024**

# Overview

The U.S. Department of Transportation's Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) has announced it is issuing Fiscal Year 2024 grants from its Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety programs. The grants will be awarded to states, local communities, Tribal entities, and non-profit organizations to support state pipeline and hazardous materials safety programs. Grantees will use awarded funds to train first responders; educate the public on local safety initiatives, including pipeline damage prevention; and develop community incident response plans.

PHMSA provides comprehensive grant programs that are designed to improve damage prevention, develop new technologies, improve both hazmat and pipeline safety. Additionally, both the pipeline safety and hazmat safety grant programs has helped to foster partnerships with local communities, and universities to promote pipeline awareness campaigns, provide resources for emergency preparedness, development of pipeline resources and information, and the implementation of best practices regarding pipeline and hazmat safety nationwide.

# Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) Grants

The Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) grant program supports the planning and training efforts of states, territories, and federally recognized tribes in mitigating transportation-related hazardous materials (HAZMAT) emergencies. PHMSA allocates HMEP funds to states and territories on a three-year performance basis using a risk-based formula. Tribal applications are solicited annually to encourage new entries to the program. PHMSA is providing \$20,075,390 in Year 3 funding to 48 states and two U.S. territories and \$1,796,015 to eight federally recognized tribes and two tribal organizations. The combined total of state, territory, and tribal FY 2024 HMEP awards is \$21,871,405.

# Hazardous Materials Instructure Training (HMIT) Grants

The Hazardous Materials Instructor Training (HMIT) Grant Program provides funds to non-profit organizations with the ability to conduct training programs for hazardous materials (HAZMAT) employees, and to support the training of instructors who train employees on HAZMAT regulations. PHMSA is awarding seven non-profit organizations and one institute of higher education a combined total of \$4,000,000.

# Supplemental Public Sector Training (SPST) Grants

The Supplemental Public Sector Training (SPST) Grant is designed to train instructors using the train-the-trainer model with the broader goal of training individuals responsible for responding to accidents and incidents involving hazardous materials (HAZMAT). PHMSA intends to award two non-profit organizations totaling \$2,739,485.

# Community Safety Grants (CSG)

The Community Safety Grant (CSG) is designed to support national outreach and training programs to assist communities in preparing for and responding to accidents and incidents involving the transportation of hazardous materials (HAZMAT), including Class 3 flammable liquids by rail, and to train state and local personnel responsible for enforcing the safe transportation of HAZMAT, including Class 3 flammable liquids. PHMSA is awarding four non-profit organizations a combined total of \$1 million.
