We are a small manufacturer located in Tampa, FL. We make a pavement repair product called "Top Patch" (www.Top-Patch.com)

We ship the material mostly LTL, in 5-gallon UN pails, on pallets, stretch wrapped. There is 1.92 gallons (23 LBS) of Top Patch material in the pail. Out of the 23 LBS of Top Patch in the 5-gallon pail: 8 LBS are UN 1866 Resin solution, combustible liquid, PGIII (MMA) 8.85 LBS Calcium Carbonate 6.65 LBS sand Less than  $\frac{1}{2}$  LB of suspension agent, pigment.

We ship separately, in small plastic bottles, 180 grams UN 3104, Organic Peroxide, Type C, Solid, NOS Benzoyl Peroxide – one each for the same number of 5-gallon pails.

A number of truck drivers have commented that they do not think we need to ship in UN pails, due to small quantities. However, I know we need a more solid answer.

Could I get a letter of interpretation?
