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Good morning,

We are seeking clarification regarding placarding requirements for motor vehicles transporting LPG (liquefied petroleum gas).

As we understand it, a motor vehicle—such as a tractor—with a mounted vessel or tank containing 1,001 lbs. or more of LPG is required to display placards on the front of the vehicle. However, if the motor vehicle (tractor) is pulling a cargo trailer, such as a tanker trailer, front placards on the tractor are not required provided the trailer is properly placarded in accordance with 49 CFR 172. But can be placard.

Could you please confirm whether this interpretation is correct?
