On May 14, 2026, the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) received a notice from the State of Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission), informing us that it issued a State waiver to Mid South Missouri, LLC (MSM), granting modification of compliance with 49 Code of Federal Regulations § 192.625, regarding the operator's non-odorization of gas.

Under 49 U.S. Code § 60118(d), a State authority must give PHMSA written notice of a waiver at least 60 days before its effective date to ensure that PHMSA has an opportunity to review the proposed waiver and raise any objection, if necessary. On May 14, 2026, the Commission provided PHMSA such notice by e-mail. PHMSA reviewed the waiver and all related materials and has no objection to the waiver as written. If the Commission prepares an additional order for MSM, PHMSA requests a copy of the order for review.
