Dear Mr. Mazullo,

My Company is currently investigating an initiative to manufacture and sell DOT Specification 6M packaging in accordance with the requirements of 49 CFR - Hazardous Materials Transportation. I recently contacted DOT's information resource number at 202-366-4109 who informed me that fabricators of existing DOT packaging specifications (such as 6M) are not required to register with the DOT. As packaging fabricators, we are required to comply with applicable 49 CFR requirements and certify that our products meet those requirements.

The objective of this correspondence is to obtain a formal response from your organization confirming that my company is in fact <u>not required</u> to register with DOT in order to fabricate existing DOT packaging specifications. Thank you for your assistance in this matter.
